MEMBERSHIP

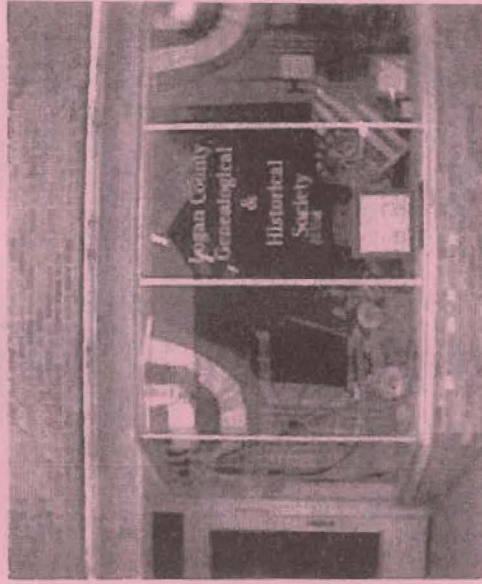
